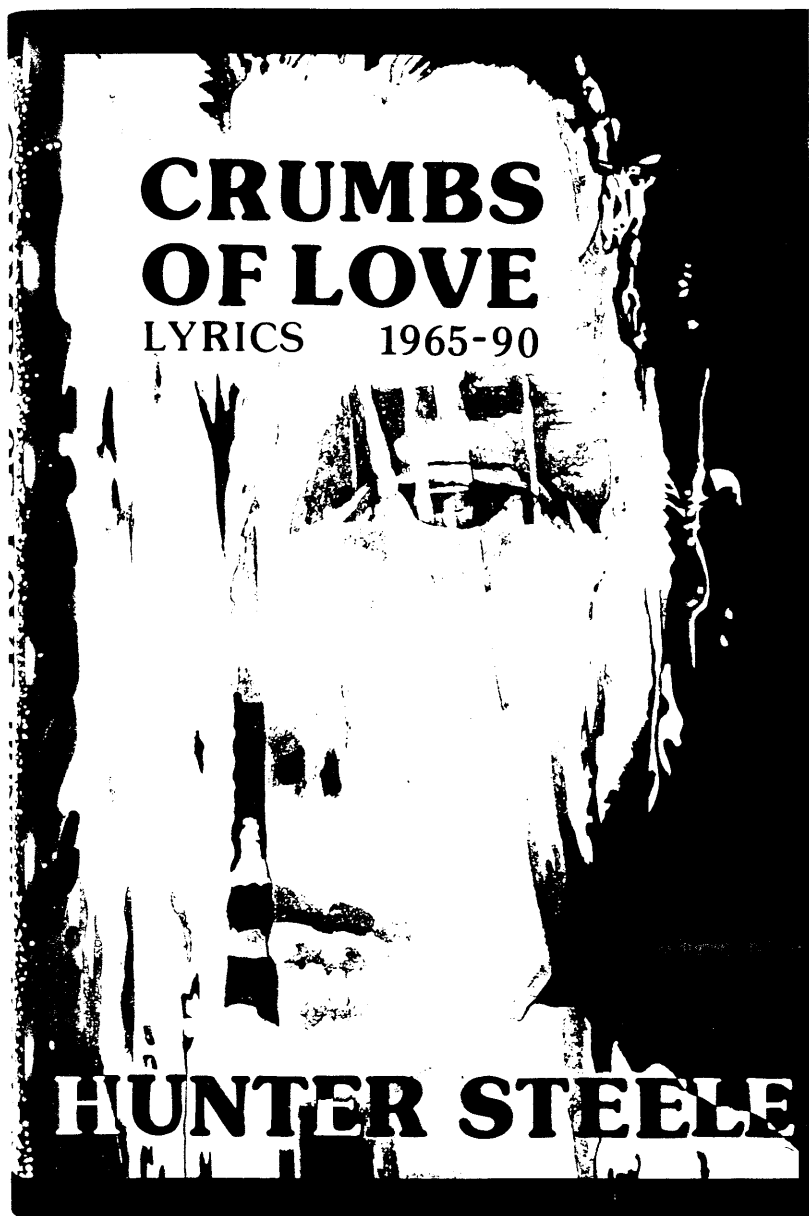

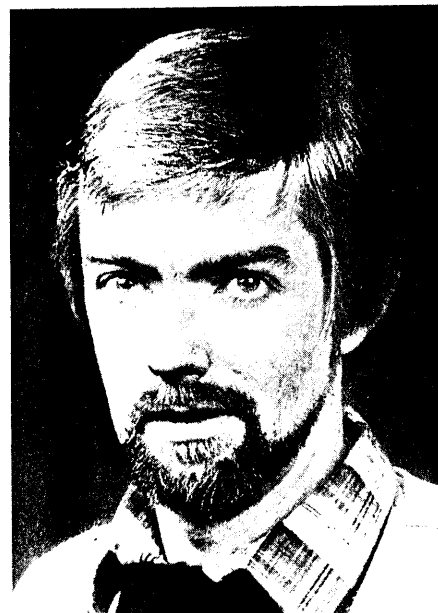

With *Crumbs of Love*, Scottish novelist **Hunter Steele** presents ninety-five original song lyrics which explore the whole spectrum of human experience, from love and loss to global issues such as overpopulation and environmental pollution.

In 'Beautiful Jane' Steele wryly acknowledges that 'Looking back now, I can hardly believe / How someone like you could love someone like me', while another song (with an unexpected twist at the end) wails 'I have no sympathy to share / It's all been eaten out of me / By the rats in my soul.' Dazzling, witty, tender, poignant, you might almost think these songs had been written by Joni Mitchell or Leonard Cohen.

Three appendices on 'Verse in Education', 'Creating Lyrics' and 'Working with Music' give background theory and practical advice on using lyrics, verse and music in learning situations. Purchase of the book includes the right to exploit and perform the material for non-profit-making educational purposes.

There are also four short stories dating from the same decades as the lyrics (including 'The Philosopher's Mother', about Schopenhauer's irritation at being constantly asked if he was the son of the famous novelist, Johanna Schopenhauer). (rb)
